

MIKE LOCK MARCHES ON FOR Jackie's coastline challenge

The coastline of Britain is more than 7,700 miles long – and St Botolph's Lodge member Mike Lock is determined to walk every one of them in memory of a dear family friend who died from an aggressive brain tumour in November 2018.

He's looking for your support in raising money for St Barnabas Hospice, where Jackie was cared for in the last weeks of her life, with the money from pledges and donations being given to the #Lincs2025 Festival.

His friend was Jackie Fisher, and Mike served alongside her husband John in the Tank Regiment for 12 years. He will be walking with Jackie's daughter Sally Hartley, marking their progress by leaving a stone in her memory at every start and finish point.

The latest leg of the trip is the most challenging 100 miles of the 186-mile Pembrokeshire Coast Path, which they'll conquer in August.

Says Mike: "As the challenge continues, we will spread awareness of St Barnabas Hospice in Lincoln – an amazing place whose staff and volunteers cared so attentively and carefully for Jackie and supported her steady stream of family and friends in her final weeks and days.

"Paying tribute to Captain Tom Moore, I'll be supporting the Lincolnshire Festival 2025. My target is £1,000, which is just £10 per mile. I would welcome your assistance to achieve the target with a little sponsorship.
